Companies beware. This could easily happen to you. A company in Harare had a break in at their offices one night last month and lost substantial stock. Some people came to ask the security guard on duty at their premises for water because their car had a radiator problem. After being helped they gave the security guard a bottle of juice and a pork pie as a thank you. When the day guard came the night guard was fast asleep and the whole place was ransacked. The company lost 4 laptops, an ipad, cameras and cartridges.

Investigations revealed that the guard was drugged and the police have said a number similar cases have been reported of late.

Conmen are on the prowl so beware. One day a man came to a company's offices and requested for \$800 for the purchase of petrol on promotion and he claimed he had been sent by one of his directors. Investigations then showed that the guy was a con artist and the police were called and he was arrested. So beware.

Reports have surfaced of a gang operating in the Chinhoyi- Karoi area, known as the Loitering gang. They are said to be made up of three males and one female. On getting to the office reception, the lady asks for the manager's office. Once settled in the office, the other gang members appear at reception and ask to join their colleague. In the office, they hold up the manager at gunpoint and immediately disconnect all the phones so that he or she cannot call for help. After ransacking the office of valuables, they leave quietly after threatening the manager not to call for help immediately. So beware, advise your reception and security to be discerning of who they let into company offices.

Also in Chinhoyi, the Finance Manager's office of a prominent bank was broken into and computers were stolen. A guard at another complex was tied up and beaten up. The thieves however did not get away with anything

#### Watch out for these crime spots

Corner Simon Mazorodze and Willowvale Road- Motorists and pedestrians are at high risk of being attacked and robbed

NSSA (Central Avenue and Sam Nujoma Street)- commuters seeking transport to the Northern suburbs fall prey to robbers particularly in the late hours of the days

Seke Road- both commuter and car owners fall victim to purported private vehicle lifts and commuters respectively

The following areas are the reported "hot areas" for smash and grab crime. The areas are: Kirkman Road/ Harare Drive, Kirkman road/ Tynwald Road, Borrowdale Road/ Whitwell Road, Churchill Road/ College Road, Bishop Gaul/ Rotten Row, all intersections going to the airport, Cork road/ Sam Nujoma Street, Samora Machel/ Rotten Row and Paisley/ Lytton.

Thieves take advantage of cars which slow down and stop to give way at intersections and railway crossings. The thieves smash windows and grab whatever is within sight and take off. Drivers should therefore beware and always keep valuables, handbags, laptops out of site or in their car boots. Drivers and pedestrians should take note that crime is not restricted to the above areas only but can happen anywhere. It is important to be observant at all times and guard against crime
