Pinpoint Tracking



Pinpoint Tracking is a subsidiary company of Guard Alert and as such plays a major role in the security of vehicles and protecting them against theft and abuse.

Pinpoint's primary function is to monitor and track a vehicle's movements and activities. In addition, it ensures that the vehicle is operating within the business parameters as set by their company and there are no deviations or unscheduled stops. Unscheduled stops generally indicate malpractices, such as picking up unauthorized passengers, theft of goods or even fuel theft.

The ability to track a vehicle at all times and for its entire journey severely limits the chance of theft, vehicle abuse or unauthorized personal usage.

Pinpoint Tracking is all too aware that in these difficult times crime is on the increase. Therefore any form of deterrent, such as a Pinpoint tracking device, is essential for companies to protect their vehicles and goods.

Pinpoint Tracking features include: Real Time tracking and historical playback Full knowledge of the vehicles location at all times. Reports, distance travelled, trips made, stoppages and instant alerts including panic alerts.

Geo-fencing

Creating a virtual boundary on the map and receive alerts whenever the vehicle enters or exits the geo-fenced area that clients can set up to ensure that vehicles do not leave prescribed areas or do not enter known "hot spots". The location of the vehicle is reported and this

allows one to take immediate action thus preventing any possible illegal activities.

Driver Behavior

As well as location and time, high speeds, harsh breaking and unnecessary acceleration are also monitored ensuring good driver practices and saving fuel and minimizing risk of accidents.

Pinpoint tracking units are fitted to all types of vehicle, including motorcycles and tractors. The units are tamper proof and are fitted out of the view of drivers or would be thieves. Tracking of Vehicles and review of all other information is monitored by your computer, laptop or smart phone allowing you live control of vour vehicles.

The tracking device is sold to the client for \$160 with free installation and becomes his property. The monthly licensing and monitoring fee is as little as \$25.

Installation takes less than an hour and can be arranged at the customer's premises.

Holiday home security



As we are all heading towards the Christmas holidays, and a well deserved break for many of us, some of us will be considering travelling away from their homes. Other than safe driving as we all head to our various destinations, the security of the homes is of outmost importance. Guard-Alert Security would like to urge its customers to ensure that they have secured their homes before they travel so as to have peace of mind. The high prevalence of breakins in the country means that the security of your home is a top priority. Here are a few tips which you can keep in mind to better secure your home during these holidays:

1. Burglars do their homework before they rob your house. It is therefore important to notice any strangers loitering in your neighbourhood or note any unfamiliar cars. There is nothing wrong with going up to a parked vehicle and politely greeting the car occupants- remember thieves do not like being identified and hence they are unlikely to return to an area where they might be remembered

Try and avoid large shrubs and bushes near and around your premises which provide shelter for would be thieves

- 3. Ensure that there are no large dark areas at your property by installing and ensuring all outside lights are in good working order.
- 4. Think like a burglar and see what they would see. Avoid putting out boxes or packaging for newly bought items such as flat screen television sets as would be thieves will assume that the expensive items are in your house thus increasing the likelihood of break ins.
- 5. Mark your property and record details unique markings and serial numbers. These will be very useful when identifying your property in the unfortunate

event of a theft

- 6. Service your alarm and have a back up battery in case of lengthy load shedding hours. Get outside sensors and laser beams installed for external valuables and essentials such as pool and borehole pumps, gate motors etc. Contact Guard-Alert Electronics for a site visit and a quotation.
- 7. Update your contact number that your Rapid Response crew will call in case your alarm goes
- 8. Prominently display any stickers of warning signs for security on guard, alarms or neighbourhood watch. These will also act as a deterrent to would be thieves and make them think twice before entering your property.
- 9. If you have dogs display "Beware of dogs signs to act as a deterrent to would be thieves
- 10. You should lock all doors and shut all windows even if these are burglar barred.

Remember to also lock your tool shed and garage as thieves like going for easy pickings which do not require much effort to steal.

- 11. Secure items such as ladders, hammers which might be used as an aid in housebreaking
- 12. Fit blinds or curtains on your windows so that it is not easy to study your household contents
- 13. It is important that your home does not appear deserted while you are away; invest in lights timers which automatically go on and switch off at set times. If you don't have these light timers leave outside lights on and possibly even a radio.
- 14. With the advent of social media, we all love to share our news with friends. However, avoid posting your holiday plans on media such as face book as your plans can be accessed by undesirables
- 15. If you are going to be away for a long time, arrange for someone to mow your lawn since it will be the rainy season so that your house does not appear deserted
- 16. Mark your belongings as such property makes it harder to sell and it is also easier to
- 17. Assign a trusted friend to come and check on your property while you are away BUT do not leave a key for them under a flower pot, or in a hiding spot.

Vehicle security

The Zimbabwe Republic Police has reported an increase in the rate of car thefts, hijackings and car break ins. Other than the trauma of a car break in or theft, there is great expense and inconvenience in



trying to replace lost valuables, or worse still the whole vehicle. Below are a few tips to keep in mind in order that you safeguard your vehicle from thieves.

1. Lock your vehicle- yes this appears as if it is an obvious point but some individuals have been known not to lock their vehicles as they convince themselves that they will not spend too long attending to something at the shops or in the house. "Just a second" is all the time a thief will need. Also make sure that windows are completely closed as this will deter the thief.

2.Place all valuables out of sight, preferably in the car boot where thieves cannot easily see them.

Thieves know where to look and the first place they look is underneath blankets or seats. It would also be wise to transfer the valuables before you reach the place where you intend to park.

3. Bags are a temptation to thieves; therefore even if they are full of old clothes thieves will still try their luck and break into your vehicle whether at the robots or while the vehicle is parked.

4. Do not keep vehicle registration books and identity cards in the car as it would be easy for the thief to use the documents to fraudulently change vehicle ownership.

5. If you discover a puncture shortly after starting your car be aware that this is very possibly a ploy to get you to stop and rob you so select carefully where you are going to stop. A garage or a busy shopping mall would be most ideal.

6.Be aware of and do not stop at obstructions in the road-try and drive around them, or if it becomes necessary to remove the obstruction make sure that you switch off the engine and lock the car before disembarking. Be aware of your surroundings

7. Never exit the vehicle with the engine running, especially when you are opening the gate at your house or just "popping" in to a local shop 8.Park in a busy and well lit areas- thieves do not like being observed or being in plain sight

9. Do not leave car keys in an easily accessible place as thieves will be able to easily access them and use your car for a quick getaway. Keys at home should be stowed away in a hidden place so that thieves cannot easily access them. Also, do not leave spare keys in the car- thieves know where to look

10. Mark all removable components on the vehicle so that they can be easily traced

11. Fit an alarm on your vehicle- and remember to set it when you disembark from your vehicle

12. Fit a vehicle tracking device on your vehicle. This will be the best way to track and recover your vehicle quickly in case it is stolen. Contact Pinpoint Tracking for a quotation

Electric Fencing... Your first line of defence

The Electric fence is seen as the first line of defence on your property as it is an effective security barrier on the perimeter wall

The electric fence acts as a physical barrier to entry as the visual appearance of the wires as well as the warning sign will be a deterrent to a potential intruder. Other than that, there will a psychological barrier as the potential intruder would rather break into a unprotected property rather than face the possibility of an electric shock.

Where intruders overcome their fear of being shocked and manage to enter the premises, the electric fence will activate the alarm system and a siren will sound. If the system is connected to your security provider, they will also be notified and be able to send a response vehicle. In this way the electric fence has served its purpose as a first line of defence and an early warning device.

How it works....

Electric fencing was originally developed to restrict the movement of animals. Subsequently, the security industry used the technology and improved on the initial design and developed a system that acts as a **very effective** barrier for unwanted intruders at your home.

The system works by sending a high-voltage electrical pulse around a multi-wire perimeter fence. The source of this high-voltage pulse is called an "energizer". One terminal of the energizer is connected to the "live" wire circuit and the other to the "earth" wire circuit, which is also connected to a metal rod planted into the ground. The potential of the pulse may vary between 2,500 and 12,000 Volts, depending on the equipment used, but the current is limited to a safe level and the pulse lasts only for a few milliseconds at a time, ensuring that it is non-lethal

When an intruder tries to breach the electric perimeter fence, he invariably becomes part of an electrical circuit and the high voltage pulse will now flow through his or hers body to the closest earth point. This will cause a severe shock and leaves the person temporarily incapacitated. The strength of the shock depends on the power available from the energizer and the total resistance of the circuit.

So, how does your system warn you...?

There are a number of ways in which the system is monitored:

- · If the wires are deflected by vertical movement, or
- If there is contact between the "Live" and "Earth" circuits, or if the wires are cut.

The system will cause a short circuit on the fence line and trigger the alarm system, giving an audible indication of a breach. It is the best if the fence is zoned for easier detection of where the fence was breached. If the perimeter fence is zoned, the reaction team can go directly to the breached site.

By installing your electric fence correctly and with the right materials, and by maintaining it well, the fence will only go into alarm mode when a concerted effort is made to breach your perimeter security. Therefore there will be little chance of false alarms.

Our guards always strive to provide a professional service to our clients. Below are a few instances when our guards performed their duties well.

Fires causes extensive damage to property and early detection is key in minimising damage. Effective fire fighting is also of utmost importance and these are the skills well vested in our guards, as illustrated below:

Security guard Mushongwa, whilst conducting his daily duties at Econet Graniteside, was approached by a canteen employee who advised him that he had seen smoke coming out of a canteen cupboard. Guard Mushongwa immediately called upon the SHE officer to alert him of the fire. The SHE officer in turn called out for other security details to assist with putting out the fire. Guard Jimu and guard Mushongwa assisted to put out the fire. The fire brigade also attended the scene.

Damage to the property included armored electric cables within the canteen were affected by the fire. The main circuit breaker (MCB) was affected and this led to loss of network the whole Call centre and aprons and kitchen attire for Canteen staff was also destroyed. The value of the damage has not yet been ascertained. However, if the fire had been left uncontrolled the damage would have been even greater. The alertness and quick reaction of our guards saved the day.



Guard Chiteku reported a fire which had started at the furnace plant at Chloride Zimbabwe. His alertness on duty resulting in early detection of the fire resulted in the fire not spreading and there was minimal damage.

Security guard Madzikoto based at Delta Gweru is commended for his alertness and quick action in the execution of his duties. Guard Madzikoto observed an intruder scaling the fence into the company premises at around 2340 hours. The intruder headed to where trucks are usually parked overnight. The thief proceeded to offloaded one create of Castle Lite valued at \$25.00 from one of the trucks and carried it to the durawall to make good his escape. The guard who had been observing this from a distance blew a whistle and with the assistance of other guards, arrested the intruder.

CRIME NEWS

The Zimbabwe Republic Police (ZRP) has arrested seven suspected armed robbers in the Mashonaland Central province. The other five accomplices managed to escape and are on the run. The armed robbers would target farms, service stations and business premises. Recovered was a pistol, a shotgun, ammunition and cellphones which were used during the illegal activities; R9000; \$1230 and \$65 bond.

Motorists are warned not to give lifts to strangers. Unfortunately, the days of trusting in the goodness of man are over as criminals pretend to be genuine commuters. The criminals usually travel in pairs or even three people who pretend to be travelling independently. Once on board and after travelling for a while, the criminals produce weapons and threaten the driver and other passengers in the car. The car occupants are robbed of their valuables and in most cases dumped in a remote area as the thieves use the car as their getaway vehicle.

As the country continues to utilise the cashless route for payments, Guard-Alert security would like to alert the public that they should at all times physically check the message that they receive after someone makes a payment to them before releasing goods. Crooks are now editing Ecocash messages and showing the recipient their phone with the delivery message. The recipient might be too busy serving other customers to check their phone for the transfer message and will only check later when reconciling their sales. By then it will be too late.

A number of car battery thefts have been reported, with once incident reported of six tenants from one flat complex losing car batteries in one night. This is not the only case reported as this seems to be quite prevalent. Guard-Alert advises that cars should be alarmed and locked when parked. In addition, cars should also be parked in well lit areas at night so as to deter thieves as they do not like to being visible and prefer to work under the cover of darkness.

Incidences of thefts of 5000litre water tanks are on the rise. This is not a day's job as the thieves scout out the premises first and turn off the water so that it no longer flows into the tanks. After several days of the householder using the water and emptying it as there is no inflow, the thieves will come and cut off the connecting pipes and transport the empty water tank. Guard-Alert advises property owners to do the following in order to prevent losses of their precious water tanks:

- 1. Regularly check that water is flowing into the tanks as normal
- 2. Check that all pipes connected to the tank are intact and are in good working order
- 3. Label the tank with full contact details in case it is recovered and thus can be easily re-stored to the rightful
- 4. Install an outside sensor covering the area where the water tank/s are so that any movement in the vicinity is detected.
